Whereas Section 294.1 of the Municipal Act, 2001 requires municipalities to prepare annual

financial statements for each fiscal year in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles as recommended by the Public Sector Accounting Board of the Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada;

And Whereas Section 296(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* mandates that a municipality shall appoint an auditor licensed under the *Public Accounting Act, 2004* to annually audit the accounts and transactions of the municipality, express an opinion on the financial statements, and report to the council of the municipality;

And Whereas KPMG LLP has completed its audit and presented the audited financial statements and report to the Council of the Municipality of Temagami in accordance with Section 296(5) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001;

And Whereas Section 294(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* requires municipalities to file a Financial Information Return (FIR) annually with the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, summarizing financial position and transactions in the prescribed form;

Be it resolved that the Council of the Municipality of Temagami hereby receives and approves the audited financial statements for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2023, as presented by KPMG LLP;

And further be it resolved that the Council delegates the responsibility to KPMG LLP to prepare and submit the 2023 Financial Information Return on behalf of the Municipality of Temagami to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, ensuring compliance with all applicable requirements.

WHEREAS the Municipality of Temagami conducted a comprehensive review of banking service providers in accordance with Resolution #24-359;

AND WHEREAS the review identified RBC as the most responsive, compliant, and cost-effective option for municipal banking needs;

BE IT RESOLVED, THAT Council accepts Memo 2024-M-189 as presented, including the RBC proposal (Schedule A, attached hereto, forming a part of this report);

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT:

- 1. The Municipality of Temagami formally approves RBC as its primary banking partner.
- 2. Staff are directed to open and manage new bank accounts at RBC for General Operations, CCBF, Cemetery, and Reserve funds.
- 3. Staff take all necessary steps to ensure a seamless transition to RBC, including closing existing accounts at Scotiabank and transferring funds.
- 4. The Acting Deputy Treasurer, Cathy LaPerriere, is appointed as the municipality's liaison during and after transition and coordinate any interaction with RBC.

9.4 2024-M-191 - Compliance and Oversight of CCBF (Gas Tax Funds)

Draft Motion:

WHEREAS the Municipality of Temagami receives funding under the Canada Community-Building Fund (CCBF), formerly known as the Gas Tax Fund, for eligible infrastructure projects;

AND WHEREAS federal and provincial guidelines mandate proper tracking, segregation, and reporting of these funds;

BE IT RESOLVED, THAT Council accepts Memo 2024-M-191as presented;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT:

- 1. A dedicated bank account for CCBF shall be established.
- 2. All revenues and expenditures related to the CCBF shall be processed exclusively through this account.
- 3. The Treasurer shall ensure that CCBF activity is incorporated into the fiscal audit process, ensuring readiness for selecting an auditor for the 2025-2029 audit cycle, as per Resolution #24-513.
- 4. The CAO/Treasurer shall propose updates to municipal financial policies and procedures to align with these practices and ensure compliance.

9.5 2024-M-192 Compliance and Oversight of Cemetery Fund

Draft Motion:

WHEREAS the Municipality of Temagami is responsible for managing funds related to cemetery operations, including perpetual care contributions, in accordance with the Funeral, Burial, and Cremation Services Act, 2002 (Ontario);

BE IT RESOLVED, THAT Council accepts Memo 2024-M-192 as presented;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT:

- 1. A dedicated bank account for cemetery funds shall be established with RBC to ensure proper segregation and compliance with statutory requirements.
- 2. The Treasurer shall ensure all revenues and expenditures related to cemetery operations are processed exclusively through this dedicated account.
- 3. A Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA) shall be engaged to:
 - Review historical transactions to identify and calculate discrepancies in cemetery funds.
 - Certify the reconciliation process and confirm the correct amount to be transferred to the dedicated account.
- 4. The Treasurer shall ensure the transfer of reconciled funds into the new dedicated account following CPA certification.
- 5. Cemetery fund management shall be incorporated into the annual audit process to ensure compliance with the Funeral, Burial, and Cremation Services Act, 2002 and align with future audit cycles.

9.6 2024-M-193 - Municipally Owned Buildings as Election Polling Places

Draft Motion:

WHEREAS the Municipality of Temagami recognizes the importance of facilitating voter participation in federal and provincial elections;

AND WHEREAS municipally owned buildings have been identified as suitable venues for polling places;

BE IT RESOLVED, THAT Council accepts Memo 2024-M-193 as presented;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT the Municipality of Temagami Council hereby approves the establishment of any municipally owned building as a polling place for any election, federal or provincial;

AND FURTHER THAT this approval will remain in effect until the council decides otherwise;

AND FURTHER THAT council authorizes staff to execute lease agreements and finalize required arrangements with Elections Canada or Elections Ontario.

9.7 2024-M-194 - Integrated Geotechnical Investigation for the Fox Run Road Project

- 1. Approval of Integrated Proposal: Council approves the full proposal from Tulloch Engineering, including Englobe Corp's geotechnical investigation and pavement design services, totaling \$44,534 (Excl. Tax).
- 2. Authorization to Execute Agreements: The Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) is authorized to execute agreements for both scopes of work and integrate them into the Engineering Report on Fox Run Road Project.
- 3. Pursuit of Additional Funding: Staff will leverage the enhanced deliverables to pursue additional funding opportunities to offset project costs and maximize value for taxpayers.
